Dear: Friends of Frontenac Provincial Park members, Family & Friends.

The Friends of Frontenac Park's board of directors, would like to cordially invite you, your family and friends to the FoF Annual General Meeting and Winter Lectures on February 24th, 2018 at Queens University, in the Biosciences building at 116 Barrie Street, Room 1102. The lectures will begin at 1 pm following the completion of the business portion of the AGM which begins at noon.

For this year's AGM and Winter Lecture, we've decided to shake things up a bit. Firstly, we've been extremely fortunate to find two guest lecturers, both experts in their respective fields, to volunteer and speak.

We have Hannah Barron, the Director of Wildlife Conservation Campaigns for Earthroots, and David Miller, the Executive Director of The Algonquin to Adirondacks Collaboration.

Hannah will be speaking about wolves and coyotes in eastern Ontario, and how Earthroots' conservation efforts through the Wolves Ontario project, is helping to better understand them. She'll shed light on the role protected areas such as Frontenac Provincial Park play in the recovery of the species, and which species have been found there.

David's focus is on the Algonquin to Adirondacks corridor. The A2A is a relatively intact natural linkage running north and south from Algonquin Provincial Park to the Adirondacks in New York State. The A2A provides the best opportunity for the movement of wildlife across the Great-Lakes St. Lawrence System.

This year's AGM and Winter Lecture will be held at Queen's University, in the Bioscience Building, Room 1102. The Bioscience building with its lecture theatre provides seating for over 100 guests. The lobby area provides us with an area to socialize and partake in the light refreshments provided by the Friends of Frontenac.

The added benefit to having a Saturday AGM and winter lecture is, there's free parking on the Queen's University campus.

We hope to see you all there.
